2015


Small beginnings





We learn

Z-A countdown: X marks the spot

As part of our Early Childhood “Z-A Countdown,” students celebrated the letter X with an exciting school-wide treasure hunt: “X Marks the Spot!” Children followed a series of clues across campus, building problem-solving, teamwork and map-reading skills along the way. Their adventure ended with the discovery of “buried treasure,” sparking joyful smiles and a sense of accomplishment. This creative activity blended fun with meaningful learning and gave students a chance to reflect on their year with enthusiasm and curiosity.

KG2 transition meeting and learning showcase

We hosted our first KG2 parent transition meeting and learning showcase to support families as their children prepare to move from early childhood to elementary. Parents heard from school leaders about what to expect in Grade 1 and how to nurture a smooth transition. Following the meeting, parents visited classrooms where KG2 students proudly shared their growth and achievements, showing their readiness for the next stage of learning.



Student-led home videos: Strengthening school-home connections

During the first parent-teacher conferences, students submitted short videos sharing—in English—their favorite place at home and favorite activity. This initiative strengthened speaking skills while creating a meaningful bridge between school and home, giving families a more personal way to engage in their child’s learning journey.



Move to mastery learning

This year, our elementary division adopted mastery learning and a standards-based grading system. This shift empowers students to take ownership of their progress while giving teachers the tools to provide more targeted and effective support.

Science fair

Students in Grades 1–5 brought curiosity to life during our first-ever science fair. Each student presented a creative project inspired by a concept from their curriculum. They confidently explained their work to classmates and parents, showcasing scientific thinking, communication skills and creativity in action.

Schoolwide initiatives

This year, students engaged in several initiatives that connected learning with the world around them:

- **Green Month** encouraged environmental responsibility through interactive sustainability projects.
- **Ocean’s Week** took students on a creative in-school journey through the layers of the ocean.
- **Reading Month** celebrated literacy with activities like Drop Everything and Read and a bookmark design contest.

Each initiative inspired curiosity, creativity and real-world connections in learning.

Our school proudly celebrated People of Determination Week, focusing on inclusion, awareness and honoring students with special needs. Elementary students created artwork themed "Together We Shine," which brightened the stairwell with color and meaning. They also wrote on paper hands why supporting classmates who learn or behave differently matters and how we can do it. The week fostered empathy, understanding and a stronger sense of belonging across our school.

Senior sociology and statistics joint project

Senior students collaborated on a cross-curricular project connecting sociology and statistics. They explored sociological theories of student interaction, then designed and administered a school-wide survey to gather real data. Using statistical methods, they identified patterns in social behavior across secondary and presented their findings to teachers and administrators. Their thoughtful recommendations for enhancing student life highlighted both academic rigor and the power of applying knowledge to real-world challenges.

XPRIZE challenge

WellSpring students proudly participated in the global XPRIZE Carbon Removal competition, funded by Elon Musk to accelerate solutions for climate change. Competing as Carbon Quest UAE in partnership with Quest4Excellence (San Jose, CA), the team presented projects ranging from aquaponics and mangrove enhancement to recycling and chemical processes for ocean desalination. Their innovative work earned them a place among the top 100 teams worldwide—an extraordinary accomplishment alongside major corporations. Although they did not advance to the final round, several students represented our school at the XPRIZE Carbon Removal Capital Summit in San Francisco, gaining insights from leading scientists and entrepreneurs while experiencing a new culture in the USA. This milestone was both an achievement and a launching point for future innovation.


Character Education

Senior presentations

One of the most powerful moments each year is when our seniors share their personal journeys in their senior presentations. These moments offer a meaningful glimpse into their growth and the transformation that has taken place during their time at school. They are an inspiring reminder of the importance of nurturing not just minds but also hearts and lives.

Counseling services

In 2024-25, we placed a strong focus on strengthening our counseling services with an increased emphasis on school-wide interventions. Counselors regularly conducted weekly assemblies for students in early childhood, elementary and secondary on topics related to mental health and student well-being.

To further improve the program, the following strategies were adopted:

- 1. Tiered interventions chart:** Counselors worked closely with principals to create a chart outlining interventions

and support systems offered at Tiers 1, 2 and 3. The chart includes clear entry, exit and progress-monitoring criteria, allowing for more effective collaboration between teachers, support staff and counselors when working with students at risk.

- 2. Data-driven approaches:** Counselors used data from the Student Risk Screening Scale – Internalising and Externalising Behaviors (SRSS-IE) to prioritize caseloads and offer targeted interventions. This approach will continue guiding tailored support for students at risk.

Parent Involvement

This year, parents played a vital role in many school events and activities, strengthening the sense of community at WellSpring.

The first event was a trip to the RAK National Museum, where new parents were invited to learn about Emirati culture and the history of Ras Al Khaimah.

Later in the fall, we celebrated our 10-year anniversary with the Family Fall Festival, which welcomed more than 400 families from both inside and outside the school. Parents supported preparations, invitations and event decoration, making the day a true community celebration.

Cultural exchange was another highlight of the year. Emirati parents welcomed others into their homes to share traditions, while Western parents opened their homes to introduce Christmas and other festivities.

Parents were also central to National Day and Culture Day, two of the biggest events of the year. For National Day, Emirati parents arranged decorations, entertainment

and food. For Culture Day, families representing more than 45 nationalities prepared booths with decorations, music, food and traditional dress, creating an inspiring showcase of our global community.

The Parent Council also contributed significantly, organizing awareness coffee mornings and engaging parents in reading sessions and activities with students.



A milestone year

This year marked a milestone for WellSpring as we celebrated our 10th year of learning and community in Ras Al Khaimah. In November, the school came together for a joyful celebration filled with fellowship, reflection and fun.

Each year, the Ministry of Education (MOE) conducts independent inspections for schools across the city. This year, we achieved our goal of maintaining a *Good* rating while also showing strong growth in many areas. To achieve a

Good rating, 75% of students must perform at or above grade level. This accomplishment reflects the dedication of our staff, the perseverance of our students and the support of our parents.

Another highlight was our production of *Aladdin Jr.* at the Ministry of Culture theatre. Students performed two shows in December that were so successful we were invited back for three additional performances—a true celebration of creativity and talent.

Extra-curricular




Our athletes also excelled in cross-country and athletics, with several students placing in the top three in their events. A highlight of the year was the enthusiastic participation of more than 100 members of our school community in the RAK Half Marathon.



Co-curricular growth

The 2024-25 school year brought continued growth in co-curricular activities, with rising student participation and expanded opportunities across sports and beyond.

The year began with strong performances in our affiliated sports league—our U14, U18 boys and U18 girls basketball teams all secured tournament victories. The U14 and U16 girls netball teams also impressed, finishing 2nd and 3rd respectively. These are remarkable achievements for our small school competing against much larger institutions.



Beyond competitions, we continued developing a local league within our Emirate—a project we launched two years ago. This year, the Ras Al Khaimah Department of Knowledge (RAK DOK) partnered with us, providing vital support to help bring this vision to life. We are excited about the increased opportunities this collaboration offers for our students and the wider community.

Fine arts highlights

The Ministry of Culture and Youth generously partnered with our school to stage the musical *Aladdin Jr.*, providing the use of their professional theatre. Students performed three times in December and returned for three encore performances in February at the Ministry's request.

The enthusiastic audiences and positive feedback were a true testimony to the students' hard work and determination.

In January, several ensembles—including handbells, strings and choirs—performed a varied repertoire at Manar Mall during the school day. These groups, along with talented soloists, are preparing to shine again at the annual end-of-year Fine Arts Celebration.



STEM highlights

WellSpring's STEM program continues to grow, offering students engaging, hands-on electives such as ISS Space, Oceans, computer programming and general STEM courses. These opportunities spark curiosity and encourage problem-solving, creativity and innovation across grade levels.

One of the highlights of the year was Oceans Week, a school-wide celebration of marine science. Through guest speakers and interactive

assemblies, students learned about the vital role oceans play in our planet's health. The week made STEM learning memorable and meaningful while reinforcing our commitment to offering enriching experiences for every student.

The year also saw the launch of our first school-wide science fair, giving students the chance to experiment, apply real-world knowledge and strengthen their critical thinking and reasoning skills.





● The WellSpring Private School mean ● USA mean


MAP Growth® average reading scores

MAP Growth® average language usage scores




AP® (Advanced Placement)





